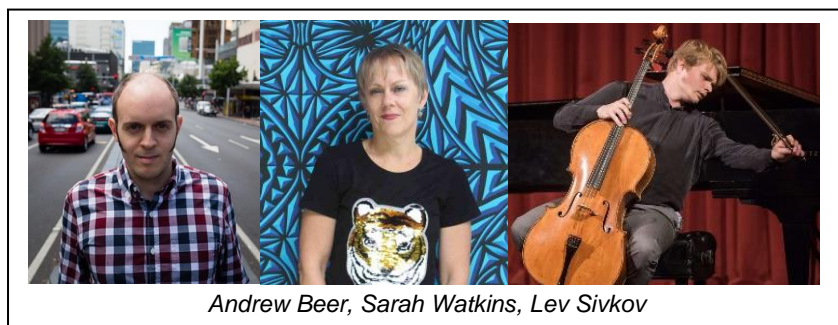
### **Yuka & Kemp (violin/piano sonatas) 10 July**

### **Ensemble Gö (violin/marimba) 14 August**

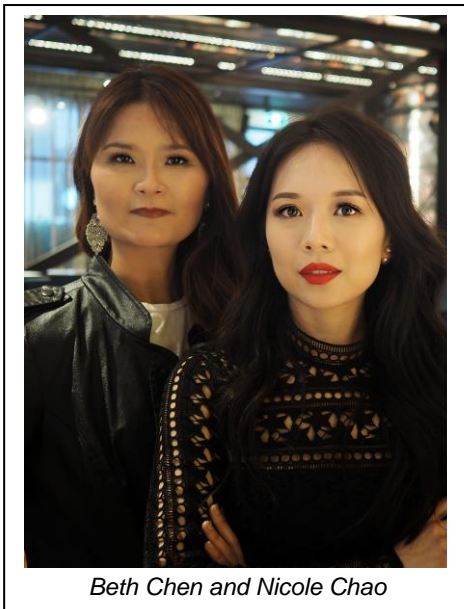
